Dr. Thom Johnson Adjunct Professor at Claremont School of Theology

At the heart of the Reformation movement was the call to challenge that which needs to be changed for the sake of the gospel of grace and to resist theology, practices and institutions that promote injustice. Come and be inspired as we explore the question: what does the Reformation mean for us today?

- What needs reform today?
- How are we called to resist against injustice? Against oppressive theology and practices?
- How do we live out the spirit of reformation today?

The format for these sessions will be fairly interactive. In addition to lecture, participants will enjoy small discussion groups, test their skill at a Reformation trivia game (prizes from Old Lutheran!), watch videos, and perhaps act in a Luther-Bonhoeffer dialogue skit.

Dr. Johnson is the Director of the Center for Lutheran Studies at the Claremont School of Theology in Claremont, CA. There, he teaches courses on Dietrich Bonhoeffer and on Reformation & Emergent Movements.

Interfaith dialogue is another of his passions. He currently serves as the Coordinator for Inland Valley interfaith working group for peace in the Middle East.

An ordained pastor in the ELCA for the past 34 years, Dr. Johnson is also the senior pastor at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Covina, CA.
